 This sets the stage that there is only one true leader, who cares for the well being of his creation and will ultimately provide for those who are faithful to Him.



Recap: Character Identified

• The Woman

- God's people (church) both old and new covenant (testament).
- see. Revelation 12:17-18; 14:12
- The Child
 - Jesus the Christ.
 - see. Psalms 2:9 and Revelation 19:15-16
- The Dragon
 - The Devil

- ⁷ And there was war in heaven: Michael and his angels fought against the dragon; and the dragon fought and his angels,
- ⁸ And prevailed not; neither was their place found any more in heaven.
- ⁹ And the great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan, which deceiveth the whole world: he was cast out into the earth, and his angels were cast out with him.

Revelation 12:7-9

• The Dragon Described

- That ancient serpent
 - Gen 3:1-15
- Devil and Satan
 - Slandered and adversary respectively
 - The accuser of the brethren (Rev 12:10)
- The Great Deceiver
 - With subtle lies mixed in with truth, the great deceiver lures men and women away from the one true leader to follow his false leadership.
 - He comes offering much, but nothing that he offers he owns. All that he has has been given to him, and it all will very soon be taken away.

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REVELATION

Revelation 12:7-9

• The Dragon Cast Out

- The phrase "to cast out"
 - excommunication (cf. John 9:34–35)
 - "judicial punishment" (cf. Matt. 3:10; 13:41–42; John 15:6; Rev. 2:10).
 - This "casting down" of Satan from heaven suggests his excommunication from the heavenly council.
- Lost of Access at the Cross
 - We see him attending the assembly of the sons of God before the Lord in the heavenly places (cf. Job 1:6–12) and accusing Joshua, the high priest, before God in the heavenly court (Zech. 3:1–2).

• At the Cross

 having wiped out the handwriting of requirements that was against us, which was contrary to us. And He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross. ¹⁵ Having disarmed principalities and powers, He made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it.

Revelation 12:7-9

• At the Cross

- Though Satan had been a murderer from the beginning, (John 8:44) it was at the cross that the entire universe came to realize his true character.
- The cross marks the decisive point in human history, with cosmic meaning and significance, "when God's 'direct rule' replaces Satan's abuse of his powers, and authority passes to God's Christ."

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Rejoicing in Heaven

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- ¹¹ And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death.
- ¹² Therefore rejoice, O heavens, and you who dwell in them! Woe to the inhabitants of the earth and the sea! For the devil has come down to you, having great wrath, because he knows that he has a short time."

Revelation 12:10-12

A Hymn from Heaven

- The third hymn so far in the book of revelation (c.f. Rev 5:9-14, 11:11-15).
- Songs of victory follow great distress of tribulation.

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REVELATION

Revelation 12:10-12

A Hymn from Heaven

- The song relays the coronation of Christ and the defeat of the devil.
- The reveals
 - Christ is the leader (king)
 - The devil is defeated
 - The devil spends as much time accusing the faithful as the four living creatures worship God (see. Rev. 4:8).
 - The faithful's victory is secured at the cross
 - Their victory is affirmed by their loyalty to Christ.
 - The devil's time is short

- ¹³ Now when the dragon saw that he had been cast to the earth, he persecuted the woman who gave birth to the male *Child*.
- ¹⁴ But the woman was given two wings of a great eagle, that she might fly into the wilderness to her place, where she is nourished for a time and times and half a time, from the presence of the serpent.
- ¹⁵ So the serpent spewed water out of his mouth like a flood after the woman, that he might cause her to be carried away by the flood.
- ¹⁶ But the earth helped the woman, and the earth opened its mouth and swallowed up the flood which the dragon had spewed out of his mouth.
- ¹⁷ And the dragon was enraged with the woman, and he went to make war with the rest of her offspring, who keep the commandments of God and have the testimony of Jesus Christ.

More on the 1260

- Verse 13 picks up where verse 6 left off.
- Jesus who is our provider, makes provision for the woman in the wilderness.
- Times, Time and dividing of Time = 3.5 years = 1260 days (v. 13) = 538 AD to 1798 AD.

Revelation 12:13-17

• The Water

- A clear symbol of Satans Effort to destroy but in what way. How does he attempt to destroy God's church?
 - may symbolize Satan's effort to destroy the church by physical force and persecution. (see. Ps 69:1-2, 124:4-5)
 - may symbolize Satan's effort to sweep away the church with deceit and false teaching

Revelation 12:13-17

• The Earth

- Numbers 16
 - Korah persuaded men against God's leader
- Exodus 15:12
 - The song of Moses where it is said the earth swallowed the Egyptians
- Just as in the past God protected his people from the pursuit of the Pharaoh, and Moses from the vicious rebellion of Korah and his associates, so now he provides protection for his church from Satan's flooding

Revelation 12:13-17

• The Earth

- Two events helped swallow the flood waters
 - The Reformation (1517-1600)
 - The discovery of America (1492)

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REVELATION

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The Cosmic Bully

• It happens often in life that after a person has experienced humiliation and loss, he pours out his angry feelings against those around him who seem to be weaker.

The Remaining one's

- Notice it is no longer the woman in focus but the offspring.
- There is a remnant from the woman distinguished two characteristics:
 - Keep God's commands
 - Have the testimony of Jesus Christ
- The text indicates that at the end of time, as the whole world renders their allegiance and loyalty to Satan and his allies (Rev. 13:4, 8), God will have a people who will be unreservedly faithful and obedient to him in keeping his commandments and holding to the testimony of Jesus given through the gift of prophecy (cf. Rev. 19:10).
